Medieval Life (throughout, and highlighted in Labarge and Bennett)

- What was day-to-day life like? (2)
- What were the family structures?
- What was life like on a farm?
- What breeds of livestock (especially horses) were common? Were the animals smaller than they are today?
- How did they view animals domestically/religiously/livelihood?
- What crops were grown in fields and gardens?
- How many children did the average woman have?
- What were family dynamics like?
- What were social occasions like? What called for social occasions?
- What was sanitation like? Were there laws covering sanitation? (3)

Medieval Art & Aesthetics (throughout, and connected to paper 3 and group projects)

- Who were the taste-makers of the period?
- Was clothing different for different social classes?
- What sorts of perfumes, cosmetics did they use? (2)
- Did they have underclothing? How was clothing made? (2)
- What sorts of textiles were manufactured?
- What were the art and the lifestyles of the peasantry like?

- How was the Book of Kells constructed/written?
- How much did music vary between areas?

Medieval Law and Order (throughout, highlighted in Bennett)

- What were the punishment standards?
- What kinds of discrimination were there? Was there racial discrimination?
- Who was the 'badass' of the Middle Ages? Who stands out the most? The greatest warrior?
- The social norms about torture and imprisonment
- How did the courts and criminal justice work? (2)
- What about the laws concerning sexual misconduct? Could nobles get away with anything? Were men ever convicted for crimes against women?
- What made the difference (crime-wise) between being burned at the stake, getting your head chopped off, or being tortured to death?

Medieval Nobility and Rule (throughout)

- What was the role of heraldry?

- In terms of the lives of common people, what was the king's most significant action?
- What was international diplomacy like?
- When did monarchs in the modern sense appear?
- How autonomous were lords?
- Marriage practices among the nobility
